Samuel Reeves Keesler, Jr. (1896 - 1918)

Keesler entered the U.S. Army on May 13, 1917. He was commissioned on August 15, and sailed for France in March 1918. After additional training, Second Lieutenant Keesler was posted to the 24th Aero Squadron in the Verdun sector of the Western Front. While performing a reconnaissance mission in the late afternoon of October 8, 1918, Keesler and his pilot, 1Lt Harold W. Riley, were attacked by four enemy fighters. Keesler returned fire and shot down the leader, but Riley lost control of their badly damaged plane. Keesler continued to fend off the attackers with machine gun fire even as it fell. He was wounded six times before the plane crash-landed. Lieutenant Keesler received an additional wound when the enemy fighters strafed them on the ground. Captured by German ground troops, the two airmen were unable to receive immediate medical attention, and Keesler died the following day. For his gallantry, Lieutenant Keesler was posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross. Keesler Air Force Base in Mississippi is named in his honor.

Philip Thayer (1919 - 1988)

On February 8, 1945, in Italy Captain Thayer was ordered to attack through a company then holding a position on a hill pass. He personally led his unit up the mountainside, in spite of enemy fire. His company ran into a minefield, suffering heavy casualties and becoming disorganized. Captain Thayer reorganized the unit, under fire, and got it dug in on the hill, which he held for three days and two nights, under constant machine gun and small arms fire, from the sides; constant mortar barrages; and numerous counter attacks by the enemy, several of which reached points within 30 yards of the positions which he held onto so tenaciously, with only 40 men. Awarded Silver Star for gallantry in action. Thayer went on to be a respected professor of history at Randolph-Macon College.

Jerry Blesch was born near Fort Thomas, Kentucky in 1938 and served in the Navy for 35 years. He was accepted to the US Naval Academy. His first assignment was onboard the destroyer USS DOUGLAS H FOX, where he served as First Lieutenant, Gunnery Officer and Anti-Submarine Warfare Officer. Subsequent sea duty assignments included: Executive Officer of USS VOGEL, and Commanding Officer of USS RICHARD L PAGE. Captain Blesch commanded the Sixth Fleet Flagship, USS PUGET SOUND. His last afloat assignment was in the Pacific as Commander, Destroyer Squadron Twenty-Five where he was the On-Scene Commander for the US following the shooting down of Korean Airlines Flight 007. Captain Blesch assumed command of the battleship USS WISCONSIN for her second recommissioning on 22 October 1988. Jerry and Karen have been members of Lakeside Presbyterian church for three years where Jerry serves as an elder.
